

Dr. Gupta holds a BA from Columbia University and an MS and PhD in clinical psychology from the University of Georgia, where her research focused on applying information about the connections between animal abuse and domestic violence to enhance typologies of violence perpetration. She is the author of several publications on animal abuse and interpersonal violence, and is currently President of Ahimsa House, Georgia's only nonprofit dedicated to helping the human and animal victims of domestic violence reach safety together. Her clinical experience includes work with victims in domestic violence shelters, with at-risk youth and mothers referred through the Division of Family and Children Services, and with maximum security male offenders in the Federal Bureau of Prisons. She was previously the program evaluator for the Georgia Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Addictive Diseases. Dr. Gupta serves on the National District Attorneys Association's Advisory Group on Animal Cruelty and Fighting; on the National Network to End Domestic Violence's Working Group on Efforts to Address the Link Between Domestic Violence, Child Abuse, and Animal Abuse; on the National Link Coalition Steering Committee; and as science advisor to the Animals and Society Institute's AniCare Child Evaluation Study. She is also the Co-Chair of the Organizing Committee of the Section on Animal/Human Interaction: Research and Practice, American Psychological Association, and the founder of the Magi-Cat Adoption Network animal shelter in Athens, Georgia.
