Gail Jarrow will concentrate her presentation on her recently published biography, *Robert H. Jackson NEW DEAL LAWYER, SUPREME COURT JUSTICE, NUREMBERG PROSECUTOR*. This engrossing biography about one of Jamestown's most prestigious residents involves detail about Jackson's childhood that provides insight into his later success in national & international law. Jarrow writes of Jackson's limited higher education, his law career culminating in President Franklin Roosevelt's appointment of him to the Supreme Court, and President Truman's request for him to be the chief prosecutor for the Nuremberg Trial. Citing a book of unusual merit, the editors of Kirkus Reviews gave this book a star rating.

This program is geared toward but not limited to grades 5 – 8. Students attending the presentation must have read Ms. Jarrow's book prior to this event, or teachers may choose to read the book aloud to classes.
