XI. Special Event Descriptions

Special Joint Swearing-In Ceremony before the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit and the U.S. Court of International Trade. Meeting attendees will have the opportunity to be admitted to practice before the Court of International Trade (CIT) and U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. Only Spring Meeting registrants may be sworn in at this ceremony. Fees for admission will be payable by interested registrants to the courts. Attendance is open to registrants' guests. If you are interested in being admitted to practice before the CIT and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, please check the correct box on the Spring Meeting registration form. On-site registration for this ceremony is not available.

International Law Lobby Day. From 9 am to 2 pm on Tuesday, April 28th, meetings attendees will have the opportunity to lobby on Capitol Hill prior to the conference. Those signed up for this event will receive an email prior to the conference to schedule visits to Senate and House of Representative offices.

Tour of the Law Library of Congress. This interactive, hands-on field trip will introduce the collections and resources of the Law Library of Congress, the largest law library in the world. We will learn how to use the library's vast legal collection in person and from remote locations. We will learn about important recent changes when researching federal legislation online. We will meet some of the professional law librarians who maintain the collection of foreign and international law. And we will explore parts of the library not normally open to the public. The program will begin with an orientation lecture at the Law Library of Congress, from Peter L. Roudik, Director of the Global Legal Research Center, followed by small group meetings with national and regional experts from the professional library staff. We will then have a special tour of the Law Library of Congress including parts not normally open to the public.
