CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The New York State Bar Association is pleased to announce that nominations are being accepted for the 2018 Ruth G. Schapiro Memorial Award. Established in 1992 in memory of the first Chair of the Women in Law Section, the award honors a female or male member of the Association who has made a noteworthy contribution to addressing the concerns of women. Current members of the Women in Law Section are not eligible to receive the award.

The Honorable Judith S. Kaye, former Chief Judge of the State of New York, was the first recipient in 1992. Recent recipients include: Bernice K. Leber in 2017, Chief Judge Janet D. Fiore in 2016, Dean Patricia E. Salkin in 2015, Hon. Joan S. Kohout in 2014, Karen DeCrow in 2008, Hon. Evelyn Frazee in 2009, Susan B. Lindenauer in 2010, Kim K. Azzarelli in 2011 and Kathryn Grant Madigan in 2012.

The award was developed and is administered by the Women in Law Section. The Section's initial report, developed in 1987 under Ruth Schapiro's guidance, has served as a springboard for subsequent Association reports and actions on issues affecting not only women in the profession, but the public at large. These issues include domestic violence, child abuse, bias, health, and gender equity.

The Ruth G. Schapiro Memorial Award will be presented by the NYSBA President at the Association's House of Delegates meeting on Friday, January 18, 2019 in New York City. **It is mandatory that the award recipient be present on January 18 to accept the award in person.**

To allow for adequate time for review, the ***nominations must be received by October 19, 2018 by 2pm.*** Please direct this information to the Women in Law Section, New York State Bar Association, One Elk Street, Albany, New York 12207. If you would like your nominee to also be considered for the Committee's Kay Crawford Murray Memorial Award, you must submit a separate nomination form for that award. Nomination forms are available on the Section's website.

The following criteria for the Ruth Schapiro Award are meant to serve as a guide in selecting a nominee. The nomination letter itself should reflect the extent to which the nominee fulfills more than one of these criteria:

The nominee has sought to create an environment that encourages leadership development, innovation and knowledge-sharing to enhance the status of women in a professional or community setting;

The nominee has given priority to women's issues, including, but not limited to: women's role as care-givers to their children, elderly parents, and spouses; breast cancer and other cancers and diseases that disproportionately impact women;

The nominee has promoted inclusive workplaces that are welcoming to the unique needs of women and is dedicated to and advocates for equal opportunity for women in the profession, business, and the community;

The nominee has provided the tools necessary to boundlessly support and encourage women to reach their career and personal goals and has been a leader in opening doors and ensuring opportunities for the advancement of women by, among others, promoting alternative work arrangements (part-time, flex-time, work from home, parental leave with an emphasis on paternity leave, etc.);

The nominee has recognized the distinctive and vital contributions women have made to an organization and society in general and has been an advocate for the rights of women, children, and family;

The nominee has participated in extensive civic activities and has sought to harness the power and resources available at the nominee's disposal toward advancing the position of women in his/her community or organization;

The nominee is committed to public service with a focus on issues that disproportionately impact women such as domestic violence, rape, sexual harassment and other gender-related issues.
