OPIOIDS – public health crisis

Leading cause of death for people under 50 (more than guns, car accidents)

NY: In 2016, there were 8,444 opioid overdose outpatient emergency department visits. In Dec. 2017, CDC identified NY as a state with "statistically significant increases in [2015-2016] drug overdose death rates"

Deaths from prescription opioids have levelled off since 2011 – now, heroin/fentanyl—related deaths have dramatically increased



OPIOIDS – NY AG Multipronged Approach

- I STOP
- Naloxone distribution
- Mental health parity to assure treatment for substance abuse
- Criminal actions against pill mills, enterprises illegally selling opioids
- Opioid marketing



OPIOIDS - PUBLIC HEALTH PRIORITY

- PUBLIC HEALTH
- Enforcement of Mental Health Parity Laws
- Hundreds of complaints in AG Helpline system
 - denials of treatment/utilization review ("not medically necessary")
 - cut-off of ongoing treatment
 - residential treatment: substance abuse/eating disorders
- New(ish) mental health parity laws federal /state



PUBLIC HEALTH

Opioid settlements – historic

(2007) – Purdue Pharma settles with federal gov't/state Medicaid programs –

\$600 million in fines (feds/state Medicaid)

Three executives (including president and top lawyer) pleaded guilty to misbranding –

\$34 million in fines



PUBLIC HEALTH

Opioid settlements –

Multistate non-MFCU (2007) \$19.5 million/injunctive provisions

More recently – NY AG:

- Purdue (2015) Region Zero, Face of Pain
- Endo (2016) misrepresentations re: Opana crush resistant properties



NY AG joins forces with over 40 states to battle opioid epidemic

- Six manufacturers, three distributers
- The probe will review
 - Marketing
 - Whether suspicious activity has been reported adequately
- Role of health insurance companies
 - To examine financial incentives in payment and coverage policies that contribute to the opioid epidemic.
