The 2018 Institute offers 2 separate strands. Select the one that best meets your training needs. The strands are:

### #1) **Digital Media, Civic Engagement and Student Voice** – **\*NEW for 2018\***

This strand will provide an authentic hands-on learning experience where participants will utilize a nationally recognized curriculum to build skills and content knowledge in the areas of civic engagement and student voice. Open to K-12 teachers in all disciplines, participants will discover how to engage their students in the exploration of public policy problems and effective civic advocacy solutions that honor core democratic values such as individual rights, equality, due process and justice. The strand instructors are content experts in issues related to student voice, civic engagement, students’ rights, and effective / responsible use of digital platforms available to students today to help prepare them for college, career and civic life. Participants will work in teams to develop a civic advocacy project using digital media under the guidance of our Technology Integration Specialist. A laptop with WiFi capability is required to participate. A limited number of loaner devices will be available upon request. This strand will be capped at 30 participants. As such, space is limited. Early registration is highly encouraged. Seats will be allocated first-come, first-served.

### #2) **Forensic Science and Criminal Investigations** – **\*NEW for 2018\***

The field of Forensic Science and the techniques used in Criminal Investigations will be explored by strand participants to enhance instruction related to the intersection of science, technology, law, and justice. Building connections to NYS Learning Standards, content area specialist Phil Orlando will share proven instructional strategies and turn-key replicable activities that will empower participants to incorporate principles and methodologies of Forensic Science and Criminal Investigations throughout the K-12 curriculum. Problem solving, analytical thinking, teamwork, communication, and other skills that will prepare students for college, career and participation in civic life will be emphasized. This strand includes a tour of the Suffolk County Medical Examiner’s Office and Crime Lab. Participants will enjoy special briefings by working professionals in the fields of Forensic Science and Criminal Investigations. This strand will be capped at 30 participants.
