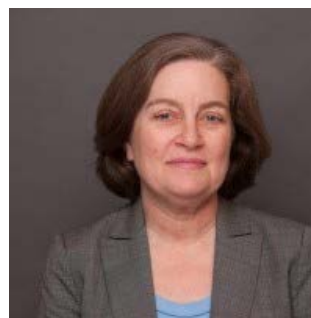

After graduating from law school, Jean Marie worked as an associate at Sullivan & Cromwell. From 1988 to 1994, Jean Marie was a staff attorney in the Civil Division of the Legal Aid Society in New York City and then an appellate attorney in its Juvenile Rights Division. Jean Marie received The Legal Aid Society's Pro Bono Service Award for her work in the area of juvenile rights. Since 1995, Jean Marie has been an active New York impartial hearing officer (IHO), presiding over and deciding more than 500 special education due process hearings. In addition to her highly respected work as an IHO, Jean Marie has been an Adjunct Professor of Law at New York Law School, teaching Special Education Law and Practice. At Mayerson & Associates, Jean Marie litigates at all trial and appellate levels. She was instrumental on the appeal in *T.K. v. DOE*, a landmark "bullying" case decided in 2016 by a unanimous panel of the Second Circuit Court of Appeals. Jean Marie regularly presents at national conferences as well as continuing legal education seminars and devotes a portion of her time to acting as a mentor to more junior attorneys and law interns.
