Each scholarship candidate will receive a complimentary membership in the Entertainment, Arts, and Sports Law Section through December 31, 2018.

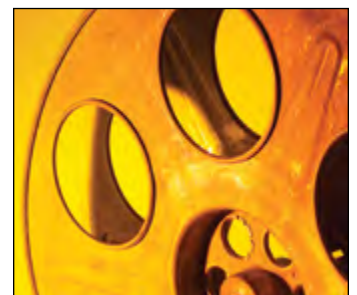
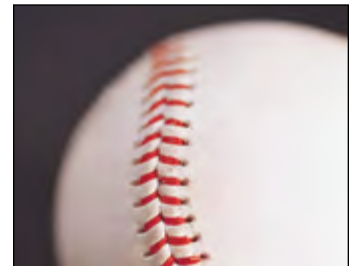
**Deadline: December 12, 2017**
