Among both animal rights advocates and those committed to protecting people from violence in the home, there is a growing awareness of the connection between animal abuse and domestic violence. Animal abuse is often a predicator and an indicator crime for domestic violence, elder abuse and child maltreatment. One recent study found that 71% of pet guardians entering a domestic violence shelter told of an abuser who had harmed or killed a family pet, frequently as a method of exerting control—a cruel demonstration of "what could happen" to the person.

This program will be geared to attorneys, both from a defense and a prosecutorial perspective, but will also be broadly designed to be useful to law students, law enforcement personnel, and those in the domestic violence and animal abuse communities. This CLE will address how to recognize this continuum of criminal conduct against animals and people, and will identify the appropriate organizational resources. Additionally, this CLE, by gathering experts from differing roles and perspectives, recognizes the importance of a holistic approach in addressing domestic violence against both animals and people.
