THE INTERPLAY OF DELAWARE AND NEW YORK LAW IN RESOLVING CORPORATE AND COMMERCIAL DISPUTES (1.5 credits in Professional Practice)

New York's importance as a center of commerce and finance, and Delaware's dominance in the jurisdictional competition for business associations, have given the courts in those states an out-sized role in shaping the decisional law that governs the nation's corporate and commercial life. The Commercial and Federal Litigation Section is pleased to present a panel discussion of experts about the influential role of Delaware law in the adjudication of business disputes in New York courts, with special guests Vice Chancellor Travis Laster of the Delaware Court of Chancery and Associate Justice David Friedman of the Appellate Division, First Department.
