#### MINUTES OF DECEMBER 8, 2005 NYSBA CPLR COMMITTEE TELEPHONE CONFERENCE MEETING AT 2:30PM

The meeting was called to order at 2:40pm.

# I. <u>CPLR 4533-a (Maurice Chayt):</u>

Maurice presented and explained a new version of the proposed bill based on the work done by his subcommittee (Maurice, J. Michael Stallman and Matt Kreinces). Issues raised about the proposal included:

- Its applicability to a No Fault coverage action (not meant to be applicable);
- \$10,000 calculation (agreed it was a proper figure, regardless of calculation; but calculation should be removed); and
- the inclusion of "medical necessity" in the statute.

After a thorough discussion, it was decided that:

- Maurice would rewrite the statute to remove the "medical necessity" reference and to incorporate (b) and (c) into one subsection.
- We will provide a "draft" to Amy Vance at OCA for distribution and comment.
- The revised draft will be redistributed to the committee and the proposal will be on the agenda for the January 2006 meeting (in conjunction with the SBA meetings).

# II. CPLR 2305-a (Allan Young):

The committee discussed the revised proposal circulated by Allan on November 27, 2005. After a relatively short discussion (primarily referable to the agent issue) it was agreed that the proposal, as written, would be submitted.

#### **III.** Mendon Ponds (Sharon Gerstman):

The issue is whether we should break the proposal into two separate bills or await the election of a new governor. Once the legislative session begins, Sharon will canvass the appropriate legislative people and then we will determine whether we will "take another shot" this year.

# IV. Harris/ Alianz:

Sharon suggested that David Ferstendig consider making a presentation to the OCA committee at its January 2006 meeting (which is generally held in the morning before our meeting), to gauge the reaction and the interplay of email filing.

# V. <u>Electronic Discovery Committee (Steve Critelli):</u>

At our January meeting we will discuss our participation in the Electronic Discovery Task Force.
